

The vision for providing scholarship funding to promote higher education was set forth by Herman Eugene Nettles. This initiative is a way of recognizing and supporting disadvantaged students in pursuit of higher education. Through his own struggle, he obtained advanced degrees in higher education. As a method of giving back, Herman Eugene Nettles founded the HEN Scholarship Foundation.

THE MISSION

To solicit, receive, and offer scholarship funding through gifts, donations, bequest, and grants for the purpose of providing students with funds to pursue higher education regardless of race, creed or sexual origin.

Herman Eugene Nettles was born February 8th, 1947, in Cincinnati Ohio to Annie Ruth Burgess and Dan Nettles (parents' roots) Monroe City, Alabama.

In 1962, he was an honor student at Washington Adult High School where he was class valedictorian.

In 1965, he was employed as a retail merchandiser for the John Shilitos Company. While still living in Ohio, he enlisted into the U.S. Army. He served overseas for two years in the Viet-Nam war. In 1970, he received an honorable discharge from the military and relocated to New York City. There, here became affectionately known by the nickname "Gene".

He continued his education at several schools toward degrees in higher education. He earned an A.A. degree from the State University of New York, B.A. degree in Early Childhood Education from Pace University, and M.S.W. degree in Social Work from Columbia University.

Purpose

Mission

To award scholarships that support student's tuition, books, and tutoring through technical, undergraduate, and graduate school.

Administration

Governed by the HEN Scholarship Foundation's article of incorporation, its bylaws, and its members which consist of a Board of Directors and Special Committee.



SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY AND CRITERIA


Eligibility

- A high school senior who will graduate in the following spring semester and enter an accredited college/ University or technical school.
- A high school graduate who plans to enter or reenter an accredited college/university or a technical school
- A student currently enrolled full-time in an accredited college/ university or a technical school who is returning to school for the fall semester.

Criteria

- Meet the application deadline with a fully completed scholarship application.
- Academic performance score on the SAT and/or the ACT.
- Motivation and personal achievement, church involvement, and school and community service participation.
- Written personal statement on, "Why education is important."
- One letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, adult mentor, etc....

Completed applicants must be received by the spring deadline date established by the Selection Committee each year. Recipients will be notified within 60 days of the committee's evaluation and the Board of Director's approval.



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Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply?

How often can I apply?

Scholarships are awarded for a single academic year, however applicants can apply each academic year if:

- * Recipient is a student in good academic standing and is making progress towards a degree or certificate/ certification.
- * Recipient provides a certified transcipt and renew application.
- Recipient has not exceeded the normal amount of years required to receive a degree or certificate in a given academic major.

How many scholars are awarded?

The number of scholarships to be awarded each year will vary depending on the number of applicants and other factors at the discretion of the Board of Directors and Special Committee.

Who selects the scholarship recipients each year?

A selection committee comprised of partners appointed by the Board of Directors evaluates and rate each applicant and submits the recommendation to the Board of Directors.

When will I find out if I am a scholarship recipient?

All applicants wll receive notification by mail by May 15th.

How does the Foundation receive its funding?

The solicitation of corporate sponsors, busniess and individuals through tax deductible pledge gifts, and grants help achieve the Foundation's goal of assisting deserving students to get the education they deserve.
